Andrew Dittman serves as choirmaster at The Chapel of the Cross (REC) in Dallas, Texas and its parochial school, the Saint Timothy School, where he, along with his wife, also directs the string orchestra program. He also finds

himself teaching a myriad of other subjects, which vary from year to year, including math, physics, computer science, drama, and P.E. In addition, Andrew serves as artistic director for the Denton Bach Society, and frequently sings professionally as a soloist and chorister in Dallas' professional choirs. He earned his M.M. in choral conducting from the University of North Texas as well as a B.A. in music and computer science. As a composer and arranger, Andrew has written several pieces which have been performed by various professional, church, and school ensembles. Mr. Hoyt was the first-place winner of the 2007 Hall Organ Competition in San Antonio. He has been featured as a concert artist at the Anglican Way Institute in Dallas, has performed for the Neighborhood Recital Series of the Dallas AGO, and has performed as a member of the Dallas Bach Society. An accomplished composer, he has written for a broad gamut of instruments, ranging from solo violin to symphony orchestra. 


